A quick update on what is happening on site and another call for assistance.

New Fencing

First, as decided at the Annual General Meeting, we are starting to replace the fence alongside the stream adjacent to Clitterhouse Park. The contractors will start at the southerly end and work northwards. The ploholders adjacent to the existing fence and volunteers are clearing the route for the fence, and this will involve a 1 metre strip all the way along the existing boundary. There has been a lot of clearing work already done and more to follow, using a small digger. This will start this weekend and continue till Monday. Many thanks to all the ploholders who have been so energetic and positive about getting this all done.

The water will be turned off at the end of October, with some flexibility if the drought continues.
